A Note from Jim



he DANA Adobe at Historic Rancho Nipomo owes so many of you a debt of gratitude for your support. Without you, we might be looking at a pile of rubble and melting adobe blocks along Oak Glen Avenue.

It's been just over 25 years since the DANA organization was formed and efforts were made to restore the Dana Adobe. The decade-long restoration process provided the Central Coast with a cultural and historic gem. There are now nearly 7,500 visitors a year to the property and the initial 10,000-square-foot lot has grown to 130 acres. The property now highlights the original tallow vat, an *horno* (Spanish outdoor oven), an orchard, beautiful vineyard, rose garden, 4+ miles of hiking trails, Chumash components, the Cultural Center, and much more. From a programming standpoint, there are field trips, guided hikes, educational speakers, docent-led and self-guided tours of the property, permanent and rotating museum exhibits, and additional opportunities.

It shows what can be done with drive and determination. Nipomo and the Central Coast should be justifiably proud of what has been accomplished. Of course, there is much more to do, and we hope you will join us along the way! We are looking to connect the DANA Adobe to Olde Towne Nipomo along the old Pacific Coast Railroad track that once ran through the Rancho. We are also working on developing an environmental and nature-based set of field trips to explore, educate, and foster appreciation of the natural wonders of our region. We hope to make additional strides to highlight the Chumash and their predecessors who lived on the Rancho more than 9,000 years ago. And watch, because we may have a few big surprises to announce too!

DANA by the Numbers



The DANA Adobe hosted 1,782 students on field trips in 2024–25, setting a new record for participation in the program. The field trips are presented by volunteers who teach the students using both activities and information for DANA's Chumash or Rancho programs.

DANA's staff members have identified more than 89 plants across the Rancho and are happy to report there are at least 51 native species still thriving among the 38 or more invasive species.

Roses Bloom on the Rancho

The DANA Adobe is pleased to have planted a rose garden consisting of 27 rose bushes representing four varieties, all dating back to the 1800s or older. There are no known records of the types of roses the Dana family planted around the Adobe, but we know they did exist. The varieties planted now include Apothecary Rose, Duchesse de Montebello, Russeliana, and Autumn Damask.

The new rose garden is located between the vineyard and drive that leads to the Adobe. Two of the four varieties have bloomed, with the third looking to blossom soon. We are looking forward to next spring, when the roses will have matured a bit and the garden starts to fill in. Special thanks to the Mark & Dorothy Smith Foundation of Santa Maria for funding the heritage rose garden.

Future Engineers to Restore Windmill

Tearly 30 engineering students from Cal Poly have been working on the Rancho this school year to restore the old windmill located on the eastern side of Nipomo Creek. The Cal Poly Student Chapter of Engineers without Borders has replaced the windmill head and has worked to make the historic windmill an additional educational component on the Rancho. Visitors will be able to see how a windmill looks and learn about how it functions. The project should be completed in the fall semester.





Chumash Qnipu' Takes Shape

A few months back, the team at DANA cut about a dozen willow branches to create a *Qnipu*', or *Ap*—both words are used to describe a Chumash home. About a week later they were placed upright and set 18 inches in the ground to form the backbone of the Chumash hut. We then wove additional willow branches to create ribs for the placement of tule reeds. We had not expected to have the willow backbone sprout new leaves, and the hut continues to grow. When DANA has sourced enough tule reeds, we will complete the structure and incorporate it into the Chumash field trip program.

Migrant Mother Memorial Planned

ANA Docent Terry Handy has taken action to commemorate the iconic Migrant Mother photograph taken by Dorothea Lange with a plaque and memorial. He presented a Sunday Speaker program in May on the Depression-era photo, likely taken on Oak Glen Avenue in Nipomo in 1936. A plaque and memorial are being designed and funds will be raised to permanently commemorate this nationally significant photo. The DANA Adobe Nipomo Amigos is serving as the fiscal agent for the campaign with a goal of raising \$5,000. The memorial will be located at Jim Miller Park on Tefft Street.
